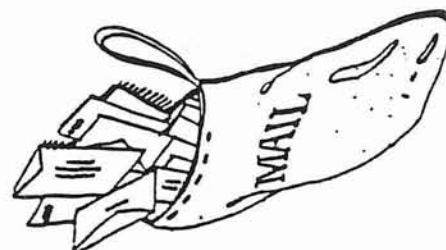

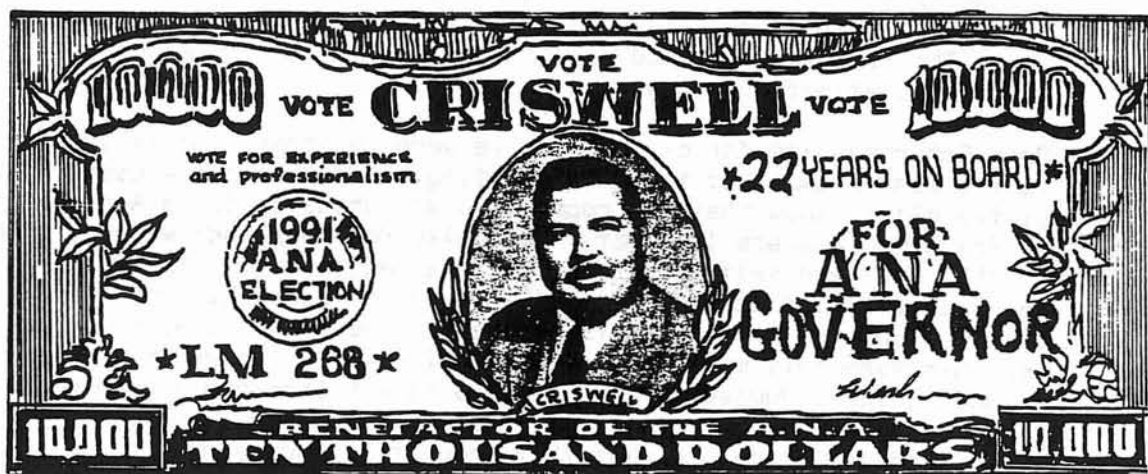

\$1 coins to mark anniversary



The Royal Canadian Mint will stop producing the \$1 looney coin next year--but only temporarily.

Instead, the bulk of the 1992 dollar coins minted will be special coins, commemorating Canada's 125th Anniversary. They'll be the same size, shape and color as the looney and intended for general circulation.

Twelve special anniversary quarters will be struck as well--one for each province and territory.

Murray Church, a mint official, said Wednesday a winner and two runners-up have been chosen from more than 11,000 entries for the designs of each coin. The coins will be released at different times throughout the year.

Winners of the design competition will be announced next year. Each will receive \$5,000 and have their initials stamped on the coins.

Church said the mint would welcome calls from corporations interested in special promotions for distributions of the anniversary coins.

He said the mint can arrange things like special coin set holders for corporations that could be embossed with corporate logos. He said such promotions will be done at cost.

Mint banking on the 'king'

A set of four in honor of Elvis is planned.

OTTAWA--Elvis is in the building.

And you can take that to the bank, little darlin'.

The Royal Canadian Mint, that bastion of conservative money-makers, has tossed years of caution aside for the realm of balck velvet paintings and Elvis salt and pepper shakers.

Yes, the mint is striking commemorative Elvis coins. In four poses, no less.

There's the early Elvis in a pose from Jailhouse Rock. "Rock and roll reign begins," reads the inscription.

Next is Elvis in Hawaii. "Elvis: today, tomorrow and forever," says the inscription on the second one-ounce silver coin.

Third in the series is a gold record commemoration--Elvis on a coin designed to look like a miniature record.

BIGGEST: And the piece de resistance, the largest coin ever struck by the mint, is a massive 10-ounce silver commemoration with three likenesses of The King surrounded by an American eagle with its wings spread. "Elvis, welcome to my world," it reads in classic simplicity.

An engraving of Graceland, Elvis's Memphis, Tenn., home until his death in 1977, adorns the flip side of all four coins.

Each of the one-ounce coins sells for \$69 while the giant 10-ounce Elvis, complete with velvet-lined wooden box produced by the mint, goes for \$325.

Mike Makri, owner of Toronto's Legendary Coins, came up with the idea.

"I've always been a bit of a coin collector and a lot of my friends are Elvis fans".

Murray Church, communications director of the mint, says workers like the Elvis coins.

"It's been a very fun project for the people who work here", he said.

"It's great--it's pop culture."

Coining a phase

The once-scorned penny is back in favor. Demands of the goods and services tax and people's penchant for hoarding the coins has produced a shortage.

As a result, the Royal Canadian Mint in Ottawa has recalled laid-off workers, hired additional staff and added two shifts a day to produce the coin, which costs more than twice its face value to mint. But even though the mint is producing up to 40 million pennies every week--the amount turned out in six months last year--banks still don't have enough.

With demand so strong, the penny is unlikely to go out of fashion or production--except in the improbable event that the government abandons the GST or merchants decide to deal only in round numbers.

What does it all mean? Well, "not worth a red cent" has lost its impact, but "pretty as a penny" may gain new currency. As for the banks, they're looking for pennies from heaven.



ODD SHAPES ADD VARIETY

When one mentions the word 'coin' he immediately visualizes a solid, round, metallic object, used to facilitate trade. This is not always true, there are many deviations, such as the coins with holed centers, both round and square. These include such pieces as the British West Africa 1 cent and the famous Chinese cash. From the island of Ceylon comes a square coin with round corners. Yemen had a five-sided coin in both 1/16 and 1/8 Ahmadi denominations. Six-sided coins were used in the Belgian Congo, Egypt, and Reunion, Mewar, an Indian native state, issued an eight sided-piece. and there are twelve-sided coins from Argentina, Fiji, Jersey and Great Britain. Scalloped coins have been issued by numerous countries, varying in size and number of scallops usually six, eight or twelve. The amazing number of oddly shaped coins would make an interesting collection and a colorful display. Nearly all are inexpensive and relatively easy to obtain.



NEW COINS SALUTE FIRST POWERED FLIGHT IN CANADA AND THE DE HAVILLAND BEAVER

Ottawa, May 16, 1991-- New coins from the Royal Canadian Mint honour the first flight of the Silver Dart and the development of the de Havilland Beaver in Canada. The coins were designed respectively by George Velinger of Beaconsfield, Quebec, and Peter Mossman of Toronto, Ontario.



One of the 1991 coins honours the flight of the Silver Dart in Canada which took place on February 23, 1909. It was the first powered, controlled, heavier-than-air machine flight in Canada. The coin's gold cameo bears the portraits of John A. D. McCurdy, principal designer and pilot of the Silver Dart, and F. W. (Casey) Baldwin, the first Canadian to have flown previous prototypes.



The second 1991 coin depicts one of Canada's most famous bush planes, the de Havilland Beaver. First flown in 1947, this plane, known more correctly as the de Havilland (Canada) Beaver, was designed and manufactured by de Havilland after extensive market research to determine the needs of bush pilots and operators. The Beaver was the most frequently produced Canadian design and is still used in over 60 countries in civil and military roles. The coin's gold cameo commemorates aviator Phillip Clarke Garratt who joined de Havilland Aircraft of Canada in 1936, where he was instrumental in the development of the Beaver.

The reverse of the coin, designed by Ontario artist Peter Mossman, shows a Beaver landing on a lake. Mossman is well known as an airplane lover. He has always been intrigued by the history, technology and people involved in the industry: his thorough, painstaking research is evident in all his paintings. Mossman worked at Avro Canada in the fifties and has been a freelance commercial artist for the last 20 years. He also does private commissions and currently has two paintings in the Canadian War Museum in Ottawa.

Designed by Quebec artist George Velinger, the reverse of the second coin depicts a Silver Dart flying a test run over Bras d'Or Lake in Nova Scotia. Velinger was born in Czechoslovakia, where he studied applied arts and specialized in medal engraving as well as earning a degree in sculpture. He later moved to the United States where he studied design at the Rhode Island School of Design in 1968-69. In 1977, he became the Chairman of the Department of Fine Arts at John Abbott College near Montreal. Velinger has received numerous international awards and is very active as a teacher of sculpture, 3-D design and drawing at John Abbott College.

The obverse of both coins features the effigy of Queen Elizabeth II, designed by Dora de Pedery-HUNT.

These two coins are the third and fourth in a ten-coin series which was announced last year. The Mint has now released four of the ten coins in the series. Two additional coins will be launched each year over the next three years. Other themes in the series will depict aircrafts such as the world's first commercial bush flight in 1919 by the Curtiss HS-2L; and the introduction of the world-famous Canadian Vickers Vedette in 1924.

"Sales of the first 2 coins launched last year were impressive, particularly in Europe" says Kirsten Petersen, Director of Numismatic Products at the Mint who was commenting on the success of the program to date. She added: "with the release of coins 3 and 4, we expect interest to continue to grow even more."

A maximum of only 50,000 of each coin will be sold worldwide. Each Sterling silver coin contains a troy ounce of silver, is struck in a proof finish, and has a 24-carat gold-covered oval cameo. Each coin has a legal tender face value of \$20 and sells for \$52, plus applicable taxes.

The aviation coins are presented in an aluminum case shaped like an airplane wing with a propeller design on the lid. All coins are encapsulated for protection and come with a certificate of authenticity.

BRITISH 1933 PENNY POSES A MYSTERY

Among the famous rarities in British coinage is the 1933 bronze penny of George V. Unlike other coins which have achieved rarity through loss, destruction or the natural attrition in numbers that comes over a period of years, the 1933 penny was born rare.

Only six were struck, according to mint records; of these, four are said to have gone into cornerstones while two were retained by the Mint. Through the years a small mystery has developed around the coins. A British numismatic writer points to the claim of London coin dealers that three other 1933 pennies exist beyond the mint's recorded six. The extra three are supposedly in private collections. The supposition may or may not have gained a degree of confirmation from a story that made the rounds a year or two ago, a story that a London youth had put a 1933 penny on the market after receiving it as a gift from his coin collecting uncle. A Royal Mint authority was quoted as saying the coin was worth a small fortune. But there the story ended. A similarly undetailed story of about 15 years ago had a 1933 penny in circulation, placed there by someone who had not knowledge of its value.

And what would its value be--if there were one? Well, several years ago when a fake 1933 penny showed up in London, dealers said a genuine George V penny of that year could be worth anywhere up to \$80,000.
